Government announces doubling of the Minimum Income Requirement

Dear Friends,

We still reel from from the decision introduced by government on Monday to **more than double the Minimum Income Requirement from £18.600 to £38,700**.

A threshold which **only 40% of the workers in this country currently earn** (the UK average salary in 2023 which was around £35,464).

Following the <u>Statement from the Home Secretary</u>, there are still many unknowns with regards to the exact timings of the changes as well as the whether it will affect couples already on the route.

For this reason we have organised a webinar on **Thursday the 14th of December between 5.30 and 7 PM** where you will be able to hear from legal experts and ask questions.

The latest announcement came on the back of the increase to the visa fees and the

It is difficult to describe the anger and despair of our members with many of them thinking this could be the last Christmas together here with their loved ones, not to mention those who couldn't meet the current MIR and see family reunification now in effect impossible altogether.

Having a family is one of our most basic human rights, therefore it is outrageous that

<u>75% of women in the UK</u> earn less than the new income requirement and would not be eligible to be joined by their partners in the UK.

The system as it stands already represents a significant obstacle for so many people, especially women [like me], who are working part time whilst caring for their children and trying to reach the Minimum Income Requirement. I can't begin to describe the anger I feel for a government that, despite professing support for family values, has done so much to undermine them.

Why should families pay the price for this Government's overpromises on migration? Families have witnessed overpromises on migration that are destined to fail but that in

the meantime have destroyed and will continue to destroy [their/our] family life. This change comes hot on the heels of the latest visa application fee increases and the upcoming immigration health surcharge increases. Increases which are deeply immoral and are designed once again to target so many in our community who in some cases will have to pay over £30k in the midst of a national cost of living crisis which forces people into poverty just to be able to settle here with their partner and child.

I urge you to oppose this attack on [my/the] right to a family life. There is already ample evidence that the existing income threshold is undermining the mental health and wellbeing of people and children who are currently affected. A recent survey, as part of research undertaken by Reunite Families UK on the mental health impact of the spouse visa policy, found 65% of respondents (including those who are unable to meet the current MIR or are currently on the route to settlement) saying that their child had received a diagnosis of a mental health condition.

It is tragic that the government has ruined the festive season for families [like mine] by worsening a measure already associated with widespread poverty and serious mental health implications. For children [like mine] in particular they will bear the scars of these experiences for the rest of their lives.

As one of your constituents, I would really welcome your support for a cause so important for so many in our community. In particular I would welcome you signaling your opposition to the plans by writing to the relevant Ministers and asking probing parliamentary questions on the issue.

Mental Health Research report due to be published very soon

We are extremely happy to let you know that after months of research and focus groups we are now finalising the End of Year 1: Initial Findings Report as part of our 3-year research project into the mental health impact of the spouse visa policy on children and their families. We are talking to RAMP who work with parliamentarians who are helping us get MPs support for this work and we are now planning Year 2 and what that will involve.

We do know that we will want to gather information from children themselves and are seeking professional expertise on how to do this as safely as possible.
